



## Improving Faculty Competence in Assessment Evaluation

MMC is collaborating with the ACGME to co-sponsor a regional faculty development opportunities dedicated to the needs of academic physicians. This is a faculty development course focusing on improvement of assessment systems, the clinical evaluation and assessment of residents and fellows and increasing effectiveness of Clinical Competency Committees. Participants will learn and employ multiple assessment tools and strategies, including an experiential component developing skills in feedback and direct observation.
